

PMP vs. CAPM

- PMP
 - 3 years experience
 - 35 hours training
- CAPM
 - No experience
 - 23 hours training

Both require an exam



New PMP Exam in 2021

- Old Exam based on 6th PMBOK
 - 10 Areas of Knowledge
 - 49 Processes
- New exam also based on 6th PMBOK
 - New exam outline
 - Focus on People, Process, Business
 - Follows more of a life cycle flow

Work Breakdown Structure

Foundational Tool of all Project Planning

- Details the Work to be Completed
- Approved WBS Becomes the Scope Baseline

Usually Required Prior to Funding Release



Critical Path Scheduler

Develops Project Schedule (Gantt Chart)

Identifies Critical Path

Quantifies Slack Throughout Project

Illustrates Dependencies Between Tasks



Earned Value

Summarizes Current Project Status

 Forecasts Updates for Final Project Cost and Completion Date

Guides Project Execution

Especially helpful for Programs
