

Vieques Wildlife Refuge, Puerto Rico





DOI/CERCLA Cleanup Goals

Sites cleaned up.

Action levels that support the bureaus'/tribes' current and anticipated future land use.

Action levels that protect human health AND the environment. 40 CFR § 300.430(a)(1)(i)

Active response measures over institutional controls. 40 CFR § 300.430(a)(1)(iii)(D)

Sites closed.

Cleanup process completed cost effectively. § 40 CFR 300.430(a)(5)(ii)(D)

Principles of Collaborative Decision Making for Cleanup of FUDS on Federal Lands Army, DOI, and USDA

Collaborative Decision Making – Key Principles



- Seek mutual agreement on the nature and extent of contamination.
- Identify and mutually agree on ARARs and other advisories, criteria, or guidance to be considered during the response.
- Seek mutual agreement on significant cleanup decisions, including cleanup levels, the selected remedy, and future land use controls.
- Seek mutual agreement on the requirements and responsibilities for Land Use Controls.
- Engage in dispute resolution, where DoD and FLM are unable to reach mutual agreement on significant cleanup decisions or site close-out.
