Hazardous waste and other regulated wastes are generated at multiple work centers across the station. These wastes move from satellite storage areas and less than 90-day storage areas to the NAVSTA Mayport permitted HWSF, prior to offsite shipment for disposal. The NAVSTA Mayport HWSF permit requires sampling and analysis to be completed as stated in Sections 5.0 and 6.0 below.
