The Biohazard Assessment Research Branch (BARB) of MCEARD is currently conducting studies to evaluate microbial densities, such as but not limited to bacteria, helminthes, parasites, viruses, and indicator microorganism in environmental samples associated with water reclamation and reuse. Environmental samples can include, drinking water, wastewater, grey water, and solid and semi-solid matrices (e.g., biosolids). This work is used to determine risk to human health posed by these environments and to determine the treatment efficacy of barriers in place to reduce the human health risk of exposure to these pathogens. Description of Student Services: The student will work within a multi-disciplinary research team and will provide technical and general laboratory support for research projects in the branch. Duties will include but not limited to sample processing, nucleic acid and/or protein manipulation, bacterial and phage cultures, microscopy, and quantitative PCR (qPCR). Other duties may also include maintaining research supplies and materials, routine maintenance of laboratory equipment, shipping samples to outside collaborators, solution and media preparation, and other duties necessary to carry out the study. The student will perform duties, as requested, according to specifications and instructions provided by the mentor. This could include collecting samples from local (within 40 miles) water resources.
