**NAICS:** 562910. Naval Facilities Engineering Command, Southwest (NAVFAC SW), San Diego, California, is preparing to release a solicitation for a firm-fixed-price, indefinite-delivery, indefinite-quantity environmental multiple award contract for Environmental Remediation of Radiological Contaminants (RADMAC II) at various locations within the NAVFAC SW and NAVFAC Atlantic areas of responsibility. This is a competitive procurement being solicited by FULL AND OPEN COMPETITION under NAICS Code 562910, Environmental Remediation. The purpose of this Special Notice is to advise interested firms that NAVFAC SW will be holding an Industry Forum in San Diego on January 20, 2015, prior to the posting of the RADMAC II presolicitation synopsis and solicitation. The meeting is intended to provide prospective offerors with an opportunity to review the Government's Draft Performance Work Statements and Draft Evaluation Factors and offer feedback and/or ask questions prior to RFP issuance. FIRMS INTERESTED IN ATTENDING THE INDUSTRY FORUM SHALL EMAIL NO LATER THAN JANUARY 12, 2015, the name, phone number, and email address of attendees to [Beatrice.appling@navy.mil](mailto:Beatrice.appling@navy.mil). Due to space limitations, firms will be allowed only two attendees. Each firm will be notified by email of the exact time, and instructions to allow entry into the government building. The industry day will be held at 937 Harbor Drive, Building 1, 3rd floor, Nautical Room, San Diego, California 92132. Additionally, questions shall be submitted via email on Enclosure 3 (attached to the notice at FBO.gov) no later than January 12, 2015, to allow for responses during the industry forum. The objective of RADMAC II is to obtain radiological services for performing investigative and/or remedial actions at environmentally contaminated sites predominately at Navy and Marine Corps installations. The presolicitation synopsis likely will be posted to the NECO website [www.neco.navy.mil](http://www.neco.navy.mil) -- and to FEDBIZOPPS in March 2015. The solicitation/RFP likely will be posted to NECO and FEDBIZOPPS in April 2015. The Contract term should be a one-year base period and four one-year option periods, for a total maximum period of five years. The aggregate maximum dollar value of this procurement, including the base year and four one-year options under the resulting contracts shall not exceed \$240M. Task Orders awarded from this contract will range between \$500,000 and \$10M. A minimum of three and a maximum of up to five contracts will be awarded to the offerors whose proposals, conforming to the RFP, provide the Government the best overall value.

A Market Survey is being conducted via this sources-sought notice to gain knowledge of potential qualified Small Business firms, HUBZone, 8(a), Women-Owned, or Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Business contractors for the following proposed contract. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Philadelphia District, anticipates a project for remedial action at the Watson Johnson Landfill (WJL) located at 680 East Pumping Station Road, Quakertown, PA 18951. The remedial action at the WJL site generally includes installation of a 21.4-acre multi-layer landfill cap. The Contractor shall be responsible for ensuring that sufficient equipment, labor, supervision, and materials, including health and safety and quality control provisions, are supplied to execute all work activities for final acceptance by the Government. Contract duration is approximately 18 months. The anticipated firm-fixed-price contract will not exceed \$10M. Performance and Payment bonds will be required for 100% of contract award. The NAICS code for this project is 562910, and the size standard is \$20.5 million. This is a combined synopsis/solicitation for commercial items prepared in accordance with the format in Subpart 12.6, as supplemented with additional information included in this notice. This announcement constitutes the only solicitation; proposals are being requested and a written solicitation will not be issued. A-E services are required for an IDC to provide professional environmental engineering and service support or manage numerous environmental initiatives for military, civil, and federal agencies. It includes engineering services to support military and civil environmental programs for Department of Defense Headquarters; U.S. Air Force; U.S. Army; U.S. Army Reserves; U.S. Army National Guard; U.S. Navy; U.S. Marine Corps; and Defense Logistics Agency projects; U.S. Army Corps of Engineers federal military and civil works projects; Department of Homeland Security; National Institutes of Health; Centers for Disease Control; U.S. Environmental Protection Agency; and other federal and state agency projects. Work under this contract will be subject to satisfactory negotiation of individual task orders, with the total shared capacity value for the 3 POOLS (A,B, and C) not to exceed \$250M over the 5-year life of the contract.
