All work to be accomplished is located at U.S. Government Moorings (Moorings), 8010 Northwest St. Helens Road, Portland, Oregon. The Moorings is owned by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) and currently provides port, supply, and repair facilities for the USACE Portland District vessels. The Moorings is located within the reach of the Willamette River, identified by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency as a Superfund site under CERCLA. As owners of the Moorings, the USACE was named a Potentially Responsible Party for the Portland Harbor Superfund Site. A Remedial Investigation (RI) completed in 2008/2009 revealed the presence of contaminants in Moorings groundwater and in erodible soils along the riverbank at elevated concentrations relative to federal and state guidelines and standards. Chemicals of potential concern (COPCs) for erodible soils at the site include PAHs, PCBs, pesticides, and metals. The Moorings is also a registered small-quantity hazardous-waste generator. The soils were evaluated during an RI where some exceedances of screening values were determined; however, the risk assessment completed in the RI determined that surface and near-surface soils (down to 5 ft) were below levels of concern for Maintenance Worker exposure to COPCs. Deeper soils, which were not included in this assessment, generally had lower concentrations than surface values or marginally higher values on a few constituents. Stormwater runoff is the primary mechanism that could transport contaminated erodible soils to the river. The PWS identifies the area of concern to be addressed by a vegetative buffer and the related work area. The Contractor shall provide all personnel, equipment, supplies, facilities, transportation, tools, materials, supervision, and other items and non-personal services necessary to construct a vegetative berm and revise drainage direction at the Moorings facility to minimize stormwater input to the Willamette River as defined in the PWS.
