The purpose of this synopsis is to notify potential offerors of the U.S Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Office of Research and Development (ORD), National Health and Environmental Effects Research Laboratory (NHEERL)'s intent to award a competitive contract to provide technical support for the Western Ecology Division's (WED) sophisticated, multi-disciplinary research laboratory that performs state-of-the-art research activities. The objective of this acquisition is to procure contractor support required for non-personal services, materials, supplies, and vehicles required to support WED research projects. The contractor shall provide on-site technical support to WED facilities in Corvallis and Newport, Oregon, and (for short periods) at off-site and remote field sites within the United States and including minimal international travel to attend international meetings and symposia to present scientific information and papers or to gather information considered useful in completing task orders under this contract. The contractor shall perform chemical, physical, biological, biochemical, statistical, geographical, and other standardized analyses. It is the Government's intent to award a fixed-rate IDIQ contract with cost-reimbursable elements (i.e., other direct cost, travel, etc.) from this solicitation. The anticipated ordering period includes a 5-year period of performance. The total estimated level of effort for this requirement in professional labor hours for five years is 165,085 LOE hours. The NAICS code for this acquisition is 541712 - Research and Development in the Physical, Engineering, and Life Sciences (except Biotechnology) - with a size standard of 1000 employees. This notice is not a request for submission of proposals. The RFP for this procurement is anticipated to be released on or about early May 2016, with an anticipated award prior to fiscal year end. The procurement will be conducted under FAR Part 15, Contracting by Negotiation. This announcement is issued solely for the purpose of gathering market research information to determine the availability and technical capability of industry to provide the Department of the Interior, Bureau of Safety and Environmental Enforcement (BSEE) with information about obtaining a set of decommissioning cost-estimating relationships (CERs) for U.S. Gulf of Mexico pipelines and other horizontal tubulars based on actual historical data for removal and decommissioning in-place. The Outer Continental Shelf Lands Act (OCSLA) authorizes DOI to require financial assurance from lease and right-of-way (ROW) holders in the form of supplemental bonding to cover decommissioning liability. These supplemental bonds are necessary to meet the costs of decommissioning offshore oil and gas facilities in the event that the lease or ROW holder is unable to fulfill their decommissioning obligations. In order to ensure compliance with the decommissioning financial liability requirements of OCSLA, BSEE must provide the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management (BOEM) the information necessary to determine the amount of supplemental bond required from a lessee or ROW holder. Therefore, BSEE requires a reasonable and robust decommissioning cost estimating method. This study will focus on the liabilities associated with decommissioning pipelines both in-place and by removal in the Gulf of Mexico. BSEE or BOEM may initiate the regulatory processes that require decommissioning liability assessment or reassessment of a well in the Gulf of Mexico. The large quantity of pipelines rapidly approaching the end of their economic lives necessitates an efficient and broadly applicable approach to estimating decommissioning liabilities. Additionally, the increasing number of lease blocks in the Gulf of Mexico that have been designated by the BOEM Marine Minerals Program as areas with significant sediment resources has caused the number of pipelines that must be decommissioned by removal, both partially and in their entirety, to increase significantly. The primary objective of this investigation, therefore, is to obtain a set of decommissioning CERs for U.S. Gulf of Mexico pipelines and other horizontal tubulars based on actual historical data for removal and decommissioning in-place. The CERs that are developed throughout this project will be used to estimate decommissioning costs, which in turn will be used by BOEM to determine the amount of supplemental bonding that will be required of lease and ROW holders operating in the Gulf of Mexico. Consequently, the precision of the decommissioning cost estimation is of the utmost importance. \*\* There is no bid package or solicitation document associated with this announcement. Response to this RFI is strictly voluntary. The results of this market research will contribute to determining the method of procurement.
