When collected, samples of groundwater will be taken, and following chain of custody standards, analyzed for the concentration of 40 organic volatile compounds and 15 metals. Sampling will conform to U.S. EPA protocols. A report will be completed and distributed to the Service and to the State of Rhode Island. The building was in operation until 2002 and remains on ATC's Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) license SUB-834 for the capability of Depleted Uranium (DU) penetrator disassembly. Due to declining facility conditions (leaking roof, mold, asbestos, lead paint, radioactive contamination) ATC staff has determined that it was necessary to radiologically decommission the building and repair the structure. The decommissioning work is to be conducted such that the building can meet the appropriate "free release" standards and be removed from NRC License SUB-834. Recently, a Historical Site Assessment (HSA), consistent with the Multi-Agency Radiation Survey and Site Investigation Manual (MARSSIM) was completed. The HSA noted some elevated readings due to depleted uranium and recommended remediation and decontamination efforts to enable free release of the building, i.e., the removal of some contaminated equipment and spot decontamination of several floor and wall areas. ATC personnel have removed the contaminated equipment and completed hot spot removal efforts. The next step is to conduct the Final Status Survey. The radionuclide of concern is depleted uranium. ** The Government anticipates the issuance of a firm-fixed-price contract as a result of subject solicitation. The anticipated period of performance will be three months from the date of award. Performance shall occur at the contractor's facility and the ATC.
