The USACE Jacksonville District is considering award of an IDIQ SATOC to provide remediation services at various munitions sites at the National Training Center, Fort Irwin, California. This support includes activities such as conducting literature reviews, conducting risk assessments, performing statistical analyses, evaluating pollutants selected for review by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), assessing the potential impact of criteria on sensitive populations, preparing criteria documents, preparing health advisories, preparing technical guidance documents, preparing technical support documents for regulatory requirements, preparing the index of references for proposed and final regulations, summarizing comments on proposed regulations, and arranging and conducting workshops. EPA believes that ICF Incorporated LLC, with its experience in working the current contract, is uniquely qualified for this short term additional effort and ICF Incorporated LLC is the only responsible source able to perform this 1-month effort due to its combination of expertise, knowledge of the equipment and facilities, and familiarity with ongoing projects required to meet EPA's critical deadlines.
