**NAICS:** 562112. This is a SOURCES SOUGHT announcement ONLY. It is neither a solicitation announcement nor a request for proposals. The purpose of this Sources Sought is to conduct market research to enable appropriate acquisition decisions and to gain knowledge of potentially qualified businesses. The requirement is for engineering and environmental services for an emergency hazardous waste labpack at the James J. Peters VAMC 180 Day Accumulation Areas for Bldg 100 and 105. To be considered for this contract, the prospective bidder must provide experienced chemists to conduct the actual on-site lab pack of hazardous waste for the 180-day accumulation areas located in Building 100, Room GC-34 and Building 105, Room 1F-28. This is a one-time lab pack and pickup of hazardous, non-hazardous, pharmaceutical and universal wastes. Work does NOT include asbestos, radiological wastes, or mixed wastes. Work to include lab packing of waste in all flammable liquid storage cabinets, acid and base cabinets, pharmaceutical waste, universal wastes and chemotherapy waste. Work will also include recycling of mercury containing wastes stored in the 180 day accumulation areas that have been identified above, in accordance with the EPA Universal Waste Rule and filing of c7 exemptions. Decanting and decontamination of fixer-develop equipment and lab packing of that waste. The lab pack will be done in accordance with all federal, state and local regulations covering the management, segregation, packaging, transport and disposal of hazardous waste. The prospective contractor will provide documentation of their EPA identification number, copies of all licenses and insurance, Department of Transportation registration/permit for all vehicles that will transport the waste from the Medical Center, and names and addresses of each Temporary Storage Disposal Facility (TSDF) that will receive these wastes according to hazard class from prospective contractor, including copies of EPA identification numbers, licenses and insurance from each TSDF receiving waste from prospective contractor. The project is to abate all hexavalent chromium and lead in hanger at Dock 3. The Contractor shall furnish all materials, labor, plans, tools, equipment, transportation, supervision, hazardous waste identification/disposal, management, quality assurance, services items, and incidentals necessary to accomplish this task order in accordance with the contract and all applicable regulatory

requirements. Work includes but is not limited to the following: Abate all hexavalent chromium and lead found throughout the hanger of Dock 3. Contractor will be required to remove and dispose approx. 35K sf of bird netting using a 65-ft man lift, and clean approx. 229K sfca (square foot contact area), along with 800 LF of HVAC system. Hanger will be deemed clean when a total of 100 wipe samples taken at random positions throughout hanger by 3rd party are below 7.5 micrograms per 100 cm<sup>2</sup> for hexavalent chromium and 4.3 micrograms per 100 cm<sup>2</sup> for lead have been achieved. Services are required to sample, test, pump out, transport and dispose of and/or recycle hazardous, universal and non-hazardous solid and liquid wastes, such as solvents, paints, and waste blast grit, asbestos-containing wastes, used oil, used absorbents, PPE and antifreeze. These wastes are generated and stored at the Corporation's Maintenance Facility at 251 Fregoe Road, Massena, New York. The Contractor shall assist the SLSDC with its requirements for developing and implementing Waste Management Activities for removal, transportation, storage, and treatment of hazardous waste streams in accordance with the DOT Safety Management Systems and ISO 14001/OHSAS 18001 standards. SLSDC intends to award a firm-fixed-price single-award Blanket Purchase Agreement for a base period of October 1, 2016 through September 30, 2017, with four option periods. **NAICS:** 562211. The U.S. Army Chemical Materials Activity has been directed to develop, on an expedited basis, specific projects to destroy chemical warfare materiel (CWM) such as recovered CWM, and miscellaneous CWM disposal, such as empty spray tanks, specifically identified by the Chemical Weapons Convention Treaty. These projects will generate wastes that must be managed. This effort also will include preparation of life cycle cost and schedule planning for the effort, identification of risk areas and data gaps, and coordination with commercial treatment, storage, and disposal facility (TSDF) operations regarding current capabilities, and establishment of one or more contracts for waste disposal services. The objective of this task is to acquire waste disposal services, and to provide transportation and waste disposal services for Recovered Chemical Material Directorate (RCMD) missions, projects and systems. The use of non-incineration-based treatment technology is preferred; however, the offerors are required to compare and present the costs of processing the wastes using both non-incineration and incineration technologies. Wastes also include hazardous secondary and neutralent wastes produced from various RCMD projects, including but not limited to the following: Explosive Destruction System (EDS) mission to destroy mustard-filled munitions at Tooele Army Depot, Tooele, UT; EDS mission to destroy mustard-filled munitions at Redstone Arsenal, Huntsville, AL; EDS mission to destroy mustard-filled munitions at Pueblo Chemical Depot, Pueblo, CO; EDS mission to destroy mustard-filled munitions at Dover Air Force Base, Dover, DE; two generic EDS deployments per year, locations to be determined; and two SCANS deployments per year, locations to be determined. This effort also will include preparation of life cycle cost and schedule planning for the effort, identification of risk areas and data gaps, and coordination with commercial TSDF operations regarding current capabilities, and establishment of one or more contracts for waste disposal services, as required by its statement of work (SOW). THIS RFP IS ISSUED AS AN UNRESTRICTED, FULL AND OPEN COMPETITIVE SOLICITATION to result in a single-source IDIQ contract award IAW FAR 16.5/DFARS 216.5, with a five-year ordering period covering March 01, 2017 28 February 2022, and an option to extend 5 more years under the authority of DFARS 217.204(e)(i). Once evaluated and a successful awardee selected, the basic IDIQ contract, task order 0001 (as defined at Attachment 0002), and task order 0006 (as defined at Attachment 0007) will be awarded at the same time; the award of task orders 0001 and 0006 will satisfy the Government's minimum ordering liability as contained in the basic contract. The basic contract types will be set up for award with cost-plus-fixed-fee (CPFF) task orders, each with a maximum order of \$5M. The individual periods of performance, SOWs, and their corresponding task orders within these ordering periods will be negotiated with the contractor. These negotiations will primarily be one-year periods of performance. Each task order will be supported by its own Independent Government Cost Estimate (IGCE) based on the specific task requirements. The option period, which will be awarded at the Government's sole discretion, will be based on need and performance of contractors.
