The U.S. EPA's Office of Water, Office of Ground Water and Drinking Water, Technical Support Center requires contractor support for analytical laboratory services in conjunction with implementation of the fourth Unregulated Contaminant Monitoring Rule (UCMR 4). Once every five years, EPA issue a new list of no more than 30 unregulated contaminants to be monitored by public water systems (PWSs). The UCMR requires PWSs to collect occurrence data for contaminants that may be present in drinking water but are not yet subject to EPA's drinking water standards set under the SDWA. This rule benefits public health by providing EPA and other interested parties with scientifically valid data on the national occurrence of selected contaminants in drinking water. This dataset is one of the primary sources of information on occurrence, levels of exposure, and population exposure the Agency uses to standards set under the SDWA. The SDWA requires that EPA (1) have direct implementation responsibilities (with state assistance through Partnership Agreements); (2) enter the monitoring data into the Agency's publicly available National Contaminant Occurrence Database; and (3) ensure that PWSs serving a population larger than 10,000 people, as well as a nationally representative sample of PWSs serving 10,000 or fewer people, are required to monitor. EPA must also vary the frequency and schedule for monitoring based on the number of persons served, the source of supply, and the contaminants likely to be found. UCMR 4, which was published on December 20, 2016 (81 FR 92666), identifies analytical methods to support PWS monitoring (between 2018 and 2020) for a total of 30 chemical contaminants and indicators, consisting of nine cyanotoxins and one cyanotoxin group; two metals; eight pesticides, plus one pesticide manufacturing by-product; three brominated haloacetic acid disinfection by-product groups along with source water monitoring of indicators (total organic carbon and bromide); three alcohols; and three semivolatile organic chemicals. Laboratories must successfully complete the UCMR 4 Laboratory Approval Program prior to analyzing UCMR 4 samples. Tasks anticipated under this procurement will include support in the following areas: 1) Conducting laboratory analyses; 2) Providing logistical support; 3) Reporting results; and 4) Preparing monthly reports. To ensure sufficient laboratory capacity, it is anticipated that this requirement will be met through a multiple-award IDIQ-type services contracts. The government in
