**NAICS:** 541620. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is performing market search for large and small businesses in preparation for a future procurement. EPA has a need for support to the Office of Water, Office of Science and Technology, Engineering and Analysis Division, as well as the Office of Ground Water and Drinking Water; Office of Wetlands, Oceans and; and Office of Waste Water Management in the following areas: 1) Economic and environmental assessment analysis related to the development of effluent guidelines and other regulations under the Clean Water Act; and 2) Economic and human health risk assessment under the Safe Drinking Water Act. To be considered a potential source, a firm must demonstrate it is able to provide the necessary personnel and services to support the effort delineated in the draft Performance Work Statement (PWS) attached to the version of this notice posted at FedConnect: <https://www.fedconnect.net/FedConnect/?doc=SOL-CI-17-00102&agency=EPA>. EPA anticipates that the contract will be a single award IDIQ contract with a five-year ordering period with one additional year for task completion. The anticipated contract will also include an option to extend services for up to six months. The government is still considering which task order type(s) will be utilized, and is contemplating firm-fixed-price, cost-plus-fixed-fee and time-and-materials task orders. A total level of effort of approximately 252,500 hours is anticipated over the five-year period of the contract. The applicable NAICS code is 541620, with a size standard of \$15M. The contractor must be capable of performing the required services in an unbiased and objective manner. Because of the nature of the PWS requirements, EPA contends that significant COI would exist if the award were made to entities with business or financial relationships within the following groups: (1) Entities that discharge processed wastewater. (2) Entities that provide treatment of wastewater and/or drinking water. (3) Entities that manufacture or sell water treatment equipment, and/or water treatment chemicals. Interested parties with the capability of providing

the services described in the draft PWS are invited to submit a 10-page document sufficient to clearly demonstrate their ability to provide the described services, including personnel, experience and qualifications. EPA reserves the right to set this action aside for small businesses if it determines that two or more small businesses are able to compete in terms of market prices, quality, and delivery. U.S. EPA intends to award a one-year, firm-fixed-price purchase-order contract for required services in support of the EPA Office of Policy requirement, "Building Regional Disaster Resilience in California" under NAICS code 541620 (Environmental Consulting Services). Vendor quotes must address all aspects of EPA's requirements set forth in the Statement of Work attached to the FedConnect version of this notice. The Office of Sustainable Communities in EPA's Office of Policy, in partnership with FEMA Region IX and the Association of Bay Area Governments, is providing materials and technical assistance to build regional-scale resilience to natural disasters. EPA and FEMA are partnering to provide assistance to two California regions (the Central Coast and Mount Shasta) to help them create their own clear, actionable plan for building resilience to natural disasters. This assistance is based on the use of a Regional Resilience Framework. The goal of this assistance is to test-drive this framework in the two California regions. EPA is seeking consultants with skills in communication and facilitation to help apply this framework and support regions as they run their own process for building regional resilience. On-site workshops in each region will help identify state and federal barriers to effective regional resilience efforts, including how agencies can support local implementation through streamlined policies, plans, and funding. The successful contractor shall visit each of the two regions for an on-site workshop to apply the Regional Resilience Framework. During the visit, the contractor shall conduct a workshop, which will be an opportunity to test the framework materials and help the regions develop focused action plans that include timelines, partners, and funding mechanisms. Small and Small Disadvantaged Business requirements are waived for this project due to its location OCONUS. This notice constitutes a presolicitation announcement for solicitation W912GB-17-R-0048: Multiple-Award Task-Order Contract (MATOC) for Indefinite-Delivery, Indefinite-Quantity (IDIQ) Environmental Compliance and Hazardous Material/Hazardous Waste Management Support throughout Italy under NAICS code 541620 (Environmental Consulting Services). This acquisition will award at least two contracts on this IDIQ MATOC. Generally, work will be performed for the European Command (EUCOM), where U.S. Army Europe (USAREUR) installations are located; however, this could be extended to areas covered by other DoD agencies or other U.S. Government agencies. The location of services required is Italy. The objective is to provide ongoing contractual support to all existing and potential customers of the Corps of Engineers Europe District (CENAU). The contracts will result in the issuance of firm-fixed-price (FFP) Task Orders for a wide range of services, including but not limited to (1) compliance management efforts, which primarily includes efforts such as a) environmental management system compliance, b) environmental performance assessment, and c) management plan updates; (2) hazardous materials & hazardous waste management, including efforts such as a) waste management, b) hazardous materials management system (HMMS) support and, c) hazardous material reuse center operation or their equivalent. Both U.S. and host nation laws must be considered in performing this work. The acquisition strategy is a competitive negotiation using the tradeoff process, resulting in an FFP contract award to at least two offerors who demonstrate the best value to the Government, considering all non-price (technical) and price factors. The term of the resultant contracts will be limited to a base period of three years and two option periods of one year each. The contemplated contracts' shared capacity will not exceed \$9.5M for the base and all option years. THE GOVERNMENT ANTICIPATES RELEASING THE SOLICITATION ON OR ABOUT OCTOBER 11, 2017. The Government intends to have proposals due November 13, 2017, and to award the contracts in December 2017. Actual dates and times will be identified in the solicitation.
