THIS PROCUREMENT IS FULL AND OPEN COMPETITION under NAICS code 334519. NASA's Ames Research Center is situated on land that has been designated as an EPA Superfund site. Several former manufacturing and industrial facilities in the area required the storage, handling, and use of a variety of chemicals, including TCE and PCE. During operations, some of the chemicals leaked or were otherwise released to the ground, impacted groundwater and soil. Ames Research Center intends to conduct air monitoring at three buildings on a continuous basis for one month that will provide insight on potential vapor intrusion from the Middlefield Ellis Whisman Superfund Plume. To achieve this, the Center is soliciting bids for services and equipment to conduct chemical detection of TCE and PCE in air to a level that is relevant to EPA cleanup requirements for a Superfund site (i.e., 1 part per billion). Sampling will occur at two locations on the basement level of the buildings and one location on the roof of the building. See the FedBizOpps notice for additional details. The VA's Program Contracting Activity Central (PCAC) is conducting a market survey in search of potential sources for a Vacant Building Due Diligence contract. This future procurement is anticipated to be a service-disabled veteran-owned small business set-aside, although no such final determination has been made. The VA is seeking to eliminate vacant buildings from its real property inventory and requires due diligence support in the preparation of certain reports related to environmental conditions, such as lead and asbestos reports, environmental assessments responsive to NEPA, and Phase I and Phase II Environmental Site Assessments responsive to CERCLA. The VA has identified and will provide a listing of approximately 29 vacant buildings located at approximately 77 VA properties or stations across the continental United States. The vacant buildings have been divided into three tiers reflecting their level of difficulty in disposal. Tier 1 buildings are non-historic and have no or minor environmental issues; Tier 2 buildings are either historic or have environmental issues; and Tier 3 buildings have environmental or historical issues and are more complex than Tier 2 buildings. VA also requires due diligence support and compliance related to Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA), which may require certain initial cultural resource reporting to determine the effect of the federal action and support for consultation related to compliance with Section 106 of the NHPA. In addition to meeting compliance standards for the aforementioned laws, these due diligence reports are required to provide technical information to VA and stakeholders in making determinations about disposal methods and reuse alternatives for its vacant real property buildings and associated assets. The anticipated Period of Performance is 545 days and the range of magnitude is between \$2M and \$5M. The proposed project will be a competitive, firm-fixed-price contract. This project is planned for advertisement in mid-October 2017. NAICS code 541611 (size standard \$15M) applies to this procurement; however, contractors are encouraged to suggest an alternative NAICS code if they feel it would be more appropriate for the project. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, New England District is issuing this sources sought announcement to determine interest, availability, and capability of 8(a), HUBZone, service-disabled veteran-owned, women-owned small business, and small business concerns. The NAICS code is 541620 with an estimated contract amount of \$15M. Work will begin in Fall 2019 and will extend over a 5-year period for technical oversight of response actions performed by General Electric (GE) and their contractors at the GE-Pittsfield/Housatonic River Site, Massachusetts. GE used PCBs at its 254-acre facility in Pittsfield from 1932 to 1977. During this time, the Transformer Division manufactured and repaired transformers containing dielectric fluids, some of which included PCBs. PCBs and other hazardous substances were released to soil, groundwater, Silver Lake, and the Housatonic River, and were disposed of within and around the facility in landfills, former river oxbows, and other locations. The Consent Decree (CD) for the GE-Pittsfield/Housatonic River Site was approved by the federal court in October 2000. The CD can be found on EPA's project website at [www.epa.gov/nea/ge](http://www.epa.gov/nea/ge). The CD, the legal agreement between EPA and GE, segregated the site into 28 separate cleanups. Other background information is documented on EPA's GE-Pittsfield/Housatonic River web page at <http://www.epa.gov/region1/na/ge/>. Contract scope will include oversight of GE-lead remedial and removal actions at the site, including the Rest-of-River Reach (river sediment, banks and floodplain soil downstream of the confluence of the East and West Branches of the Housatonic River), the Upper 1/2 Mile Reach, the 1-1/2 Mile Reach, floodplains, the GE Plant site, Silver Lake, Former Oxbow Areas, Allendale School, groundwater, and other areas impacted by GE's operations. Technical services include, but are not limited to, remedial/removal investigations and site characterization, feasibility studies, review of design documents, oversight of removal/remediation actions, (including sediment remediation activities such as dredging, excavation, and stream restoration) litigation support, oversight of other GE activities, including post-removal site control actions, groundwater investigation, monitoring, assessment and response actions, and any other actions necessary to provide oversight of removal/remediation activities at this site.
