Many of these studies are conducted at the T&E Facility located in Cincinnati, Ohio. The proposed contract will provide day-to-day technical operation of this facility, as well as technical support of the test and evaluation research and development and demonstration verification studies. This also supports the activities at the T&E Facility, the Experiment Stream Facility, and other NRMRL Cincinnati satellite facilities.
