UCOR (Contractor), under its prime contract with the U.S. Department of Energy located in Oak Ridge, Tennessee, is seeking sources with the capability to provide treatment and disposal of radioactively contaminated liquid-phase waste that carries numerous RCRA hazardous waste identification codes, including F020 and F027. The waste to be treated is a primarily aqueous liquid. This liquid is condensate from the vacuum-assisted thermal desorption of numerous waste streams from DOEs Oak Ridge Reservation. As a consequence of the RCRA "derived from" rule, this waste has been assigned numerous D, F, U, and P RCRA Hazardous Waste Codes, including the codes F020 and F027, which require the treatment of various dioxin and furan compounds. The waste also contains polychlorinated biphenyl at concentrations up to approximately 6,786 parts per million. The waste must NOT be treated on the DOE Oak Ridge Reservation. UCOR recognizes that vendors may need to obtain treatment and disposal variances under RCRA to treat and dispose of this waste. The subcontractor shall furnish all parts, labor, disposal variances under RCRA to treat and dispose of this waste. The subcontractor shall furnish all parts, labor, supervision and material necessary to receive, treat and dispose of this waste. The subcontractor shall diffice and parts, labor, supervision and material necessary to receive, treat and dispose approximately 18 drums of liquid-phase waste. The current schedule anticipates the waste being shipped off the ETTP site by approximately March 2019. Responses shall provide written documentation of capability to perform the requested services.
