The Mine Safety & Health Administration (MSHA) is issuing this Sources Sought Notice - Request for Information to improve its understanding of the market and identify qualified vendors capable of analyzing and/or assessing water piping issues relative to lead contamination and other age-related piping issues and providing a detailed remediation plan. Recent water quality tests have indicated some localized lead issues. Interested vendors must be capable of analyzing and/or assessing water piping issues relative to lead contamination and other age-related piping issues. Interested vendors must be willing to provide different options for inspection of piping, identification of high risk pipes or areas where failure could lead to health or environmental damage, and assessment, and then to provide a detailed plan to address any problems found. The main goal is to identify the source of lead leaching in the areas where water quality tests determined that issues exist. The second area of concern for MSHA is other piping issues throughout the facility that are likely related to the age of pipes, including pipe tuberculation. The water is often rust colored and affects laundry and plumbing fixtures. MSHA is interested in better understanding the available remedial options to deal with these types of issues. Interested vendors must be licensed and insured in the field of analyzing and assessing plumbing and water piping issues and capable of providing a detailed plan of action to address the lead problems. This request for information is being issued by URS | CH2M Oak Ridge LLC (UCOR), prime contractor for DOE at the East Tennessee Technology Park, Oak Ridge, TN. UCOR is seeking a comprehensive solution to efficiently process Building 3608 Process Water (PW) in support of the NPDES permit and in accordance with the regulations established by DOE, EPA's CleanWater Act of 1977, and the State of Tennessee. Building 3608 isa facility designed to pretreat (i.e., soften) radiological processwastewater, which is then sent to Bldg. 3544. This building also treats non-radiological process wastewater generated at ORNL to levels of pollutants acceptable under restrictions imposed by the effluent limits specified in its NPDES permit. Non-radiological process wastewater is treated to remove organics, particulates, and heavy metals and to adjust the pH value of the wastewater prior to its discharge to White Oak Creek. Building 3608

also provides water softening to the radiological wastewater before it is sent to Bldg. 3544 for radiological treatment. Specifically, the proposed method of PW treatment would replace process water clarification (clarifier) and the processing of generated sludge for disposal (filter press). Expected design life is 20+ years. It has been suggested that a portable (skid) and exterior method for processing and pre-treatment of Building 3608 PW could be possible. This PW has multiple storm runoff and process facility sources as well as radiological and non-radiological, chemical, and other hazardous sources from ORNL facilities. The system will need to prepare the PW to be treated by granular activated carbon (GAC) treatment filters and then finally the zeolite process filters at the facility. Point-source treatment solutions should be considered. Interested parties are invited to provide written documentation describing proposed methods of treatment, include portable (skid) and exterior methods for processing and pre-treatment of Building 3608 PW.
