The FUSRAP material at the IAAAP is soil contaminated with depleted uranium and small amounts of debris. At each site, the incumbent Remedial Action Contractor (RA Contractor) is responsible for the excavation of radiologically impacted material, staging, loading of rail cars and preparing all appropriate manifests and related documentation for shipment. At each site the incumbent Transportation & Disposal Contractor is responsible for the shipping and offsite disposal of DOT Class 7, Class 9, or non-regulated materials. The Quality Assurance (QA) contractor responsibilities will provide the Quality Assurance and Construction Management for the FUSRAP remediation activities at the St. Louis FUSRAP sites. In addition to services provided to FUSRAP, other MVS construction projects may require use of the QA contractor for additional duties.
