## Z -- FIRING RANGE MAINTENANCE (COMBINE)

**NAICS:** 562910. THIS IS A TOTAL SMALL BUSINESS SET-ASIDE. The U.S. Department of the Air Force, Air Force Global Strike Command requires a contractor to complete a bullet trap inspection, and to flip and rotate plates on an annual basis at three firing ranges at Minot AFB in North Dakota. Work includes removal of minor lead buildup in the throat of the bullet trap and HEPA vacuuming of the floor area underneath and behind the bullet trap while the plates are off the traps and HEPA vacuuming of the range floors. ## F -- BULLET TRAP MAINTENANCE AND RANGE CLEANING SERVICES (SOL)

**NAICS:** 562112. THIS IS A TOTAL SMALL BUSINESS SET-ASIDE. The U.S. Coast Guard's Special Mission Training Center in Honolulu, Hawaii, requires comprehensive bullet trap maintenance and range cleaning services at the Dexter Small Arms Firing Range. The range utilizes a rubber pellet bullet trap to catch fired rounds. Over time, this bullet trap needs to be pulled out and sifted so that the waste debris can be properly disposed of. During that time the back wall of the range is inspected for damage, then all pellets are put back in place and fresh pellets can be added if necessary. This cleaning process is required on a biennial basis and is due this year. The Dexter range is a frangible-only range though trace amounts of lead are possible. Interested bidders are encouraged to attend a site visit scheduled at 10:00 AM HST on July 24, 2024. The period of performance for this contract must be completed within 14 calendar days of award. OFFERS ARE DUE BY 11:00 AM EDT ON JULY 31, 2024.

## Z -- USMS INDOOR FIRE RANGE CLEANING (SOL)

**NAICS:** 562211. THIS IS A TOTAL SMALL BUSINESS SET-ASIDE. The General Services Administration requires a contractor to provide firing range cleaning and housekeeping services at the Roman Hruska U.S. Courthouse in Omaha, Nebraska. The base bid shall include all cleaning, preventative maintenance and testing services in accordance with the

scope of work. Housekeeping shall be performed six months after the completion of comprehensive cleaning. The range was constructed in 1999 and is approximately 1552 square feet with a range office that is 219 square feet. The floor is constructed of concrete, the walls are made up of a concrete masonry unit (CMU), and the ceiling is a finished drywall with hanging baffles covering the concrete deck above. Interested contractors are encouraged to register for a pre-proposal site visit. The estimated price range for this project is between \$25,000 and \$100,000. The award will be a firm-fixed-price contract with one-year period of performance upon receipt of the Notice to Proceed. OFFERS ARE DUE BY 4:00 PM ON AUGUST 5, 2024.

#### **F -- BDU-33 DEMIL RANGE CLEANUP (COMBINE)**

**NAICS:** 562910. THIS IS A FULL AND OPEN COMPETITION. The U.S. Department of the Army, National Guard Bureau, requires a contractor to perform the inspection, demilitarization (demil), and disposal of all BDU-33 munitions debris at the Airburst Range in Fort Carson, Colorado, with the goal to process BDU33 munitions to meet demil regulatory guidance. ANG ranges are used for various types of training including air-to-surface weapons delivery training, air-to-air combat, close air support, combat search and rescue, Special Forces ground exercises, and electronic combat training. Aircrews strike targets with bombs. Munitions may be full-scale or sub-scale practice munitions (Bomb Dummy Unit or BDU) with or without spotting charges, or inert practice ammunition. The contractor shall provide all labor, material, and equipment to perform the work specified including proper handling of materials regulated under the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA), transfer of RCRA-regulated materials to the appropriate installation program for Government disposition services, as defined in this PWS. All work site personnel must have a current OSHA 40-hour Hazardous Waste Operations (HAZWOPER) training. The SUXOS or acting site manager must also have 8-hour HAZWOPER Supervisor training. No site activity shall take place without the presence of a qualified SUXOS. UXO Technician I must not perform inspection duties designated for higher qualified personnel. This will be a one-time service with a six-month period of performance. The award shall be based on the best value to the Government. A site visit is scheduled at 10:00 AM MDT on August 1. OFFERS ARE DUE BY 5:00 PM MDT ON AUGUST 9, 2024.

#### **F -- SPE603-24-R-5X04 DFSP CHARLESTON ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES (PRESOL)**

**NAICS:** 562910. WHEN THIS SOLICITATION IS RELEASED ON OR ABOUT SEPTEMBER 11, 2024, IT WILL BE COMPETED AS A TOTAL SMALL BUSINESS SET-ASIDE. The U.S. Department of Defense Logistics Agency, DLA Energy, plans to issue a solicitation for environmental remediation, environmental compliance, and environmental facility maintenance services at its Defense Fuel Support Point (DFSP) in Charleston, South Carolina. DLA Energy's Engineering, Environmental and Property Division (LEV) is responsible for funding, supporting, and overseeing execution of DLA Energy's environmental requirements. Site closure is the primary goal of this effort while restoring and maintaining the facility in a cost-effective manner. This anticipated contract is expected to have a four-year period of performance from April 1, 2025, through March 31, 2029, and a six-month extension provision from April 1, 2029, through October 31, 2029. The award is expected to be one firm-fixed-price contract. There is no solicitation at this time.
