## **F -- F108--ASBESTOS ABATEMENT CANTEEN AREAS (SRCSGT)**

**NAICS:** 562910. THIS IS A SOURCES SOUGHT NOTICE FOR MARKETING RESEARCH PURPOSES ONLY. The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) seeks to identify interested firms that are qualified to remove and dispose of asbestos-containing material (ACM) in Building 3's Veterans Canteen Service Storage (Room 105), Canteen Office Area (Rooms 114 & 114B), and Retail Store Area (Room 112). ACMs to be removed are Category 1 Non-friable materials. A limited survey report and PDF drawings are available on request. The VA Medical Center considers the removal of ACM a regulated, Class II asbestos removal that shall be cleared by visual inspection and the collection of multiple air samples that will be analyzed by TEM analysis. A third-party air monitoring firm, retained by the VA, shall conduct continuous project monitoring during removal activities and perform the final visual inspection and clearance sampling. The vendor shall be responsible for acquiring appropriate permits. This project shall be completed in three separate phases. Phase 1 will be the removal of ACM in Rooms 105 and Room 114. Phase II will be the removal of ACM in Room 112 during the proposed remodel. Phase III will be replacing the flooring throughout with Luxury Vinyl Tile (LVT). The VA requests the removal activities for each phase to be completed during a single weekend (three consecutive days or less). Interior Mobilization shall begin no earlier than 4:00 PM Friday and conclude no later than 5:00 Monday. CAPABILITY STATEMENTS ARE DUE BY 3:30 PM EST ON DECEMBER 2, 2024.

## **F -- F108--SHERIDAN VAMC BLDG. 42 HAZMAT CLEANUP (COMBINE)**

**SOL:** 36C25925Q0085

**DUE:** December 6, 2024

**NAICS:** 562112. THIS IS A SERVICE-DISABLED VETERAN-OWNED SMALL BUSINESS SET-ASIDE. The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs requires cleaning and removal of oils and other contaminants from Building 42 at the Sheridan VA Medical Center--Station 666 in Sheridan, WY. A vehicle crashed into the corner of the building where the bulk fluid storage was placed, thus spreading the fluids throughout the interior of the building covering the ceiling, walls, equipment, tools, electrical fixtures, an office area, and loft. The fluids stored that were impacted and dispersed are Synthetic Motor Oil, Hydraulic Fluid, and Antifreeze. Most remnants of the building damage will need to be removed and tracked with receipts to where the materials were taken. The government anticipates awarding a Purchase Order contract resulting from this solicitation. OFFERS ARE DUE BY 1:00 PM MST ON DECEMBER 6, 2024.

**F -- ENVIRONMENTAL REMEDIATION SERVICES MATOC (SOL)**

**SOL:** 140A1625R0007

**NAICS:** 562910. THIS IS AN INDIAN SMALL BUSINESS ECONOMIC ENTERPRISE (ISBEE) SET-ASIDE (SPECIFIC TO THE DEPARTMENT OF INTERIOR AND INDIAN HEALTH SERVICES). The Bureau of Indian Education requires a contractor to prepare an environmental hazardous material assessment and conduct remediation and repairs and radon mitigation at the Standing Rock Agency/Community School in Fort Yates, North Dakota. Work includes conducting assessments to confirm asbestos-containing material (ACM) and lead-based paint (LBP) quantities and the extent of mold contamination, designing a radon gas mitigation system, preparing a proposal to implement the mitigation work plan, and implementing the mitigation work plan and installing a radon mitigation system. Services also include repairing and replacing interior walls, floors, insulation, crawlspaces, ceiling, and roof sections directly impacted by remediation efforts, damaged, or contributing to the cause of mold growth (i.e., waterlogged materials), and radon mitigation system installation. The proposal will offer prices no higher than the ceiling prices established in the IDIQ Binding Price Schedule. The award will be a five-year multiple-award Indefinite Quantity/Indefinite Delivery (IDIQ) contract with firm-fixed-priced task orders. Awardees will compete for task orders, and task order awardees will be responsible for all labor, supervision, materials, equipment, tools, parts, supplies, and transportation to perform the services described in the drawings and specifications for each project. The Bureau of Indian Affairs plans to award three IDIQ contracts to qualified offerors. Most projects awarded on this contract will have an estimated cost of approximately \$10,000 to \$2,000,000; however, smaller, and larger dollar-value projects may be considered. OFFERS ARE DUE BY 5:00 PM EST ON JANUARY 14, 2025.
