NAICS: 541330. THIS IS A FULL AND OPEN COMPETITION. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), Mobile District, seeks Architect-Engineer (A-E) services to support its Environmental Restoration (ER) Program. Services will primarily be performed within the Mobile District Area of Responsibility (AOR), including the southeastern United States, Central and South America, Puerto Rico, and the U.S. Virgin Islands, with the potential for work in other USACE districts as required. The contractor shall provide comprehensive environmental engineering and technical support for Hazardous, Toxic, and Radioactive Waste (HTRW) projects, including environmental investigations, site assessments, feasibility studies, remedial design, regulatory compliance support, risk assessments, sampling and analysis, data management, geotechnical investigations, groundwater and surface water studies, vapor intrusion investigations, monitoring well installation, groundwater modeling, environmental site assessments, asbestos and lead-based paint surveys, and investigations of emerging contaminants, including per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS). NAICS: 562112. THIS IS A WOMEN-OWNED SMALL BUSINESS SET-ASIDE. The U.S. Coast Guard seeks a contractor to provide quarterly cleaning and preventive maintenance services for the six-lane indoor small arms firing range at Joint Base Cape Cod in Buzzards Bay, Massachusetts. Services include lead abatement cleaning, hazardous waste handling and disposal, bullet trap maintenance, ventilation and HVAC system maintenance, spill and release prevention, filter replacement, airflow testing, inspections, reporting, and recommendations for repairs. The contractor shall provide qualified personnel, required certifications, equipment, quality control, and all documentation necessary to ensure compliance with applicable federal, state, OSHA, EPA, and Massachusetts lead safety regulations. F -- INDEFINITE-DELIVERY/INDEFINITE-QUANTITY (ID/IQ) SMALL BUSINESS ENVIRONMENTAL REMEDIAL ACTION CONTRACT FOR SITES IN HAWAII, GUAM, AND OTHER AREAS WITHIN THE NAVAL FACILITIES ENGINEERING SYSTEMS COMMAND PACIFIC AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY VI (SBRAC VI) (SOL)

NAICS: 562910. THIS IS A TOTAL SMALL BUSINESS SET-ASIDE. The Naval Facilities Engineering Systems Command (NAVFAC) Pacific seeks a contractor to perform remedial actions at environmentally contaminated sites, predominantly located at Navy and Marine Corps installations and other Government agency sites. The sites will consist of those ranked on the Superfund National Priority List (NPL) as well as non-NPL sites and Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) sites regulated under Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA), Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA), Underground Storage Tanks (UST) regulations, state specific regulations, and other sites that might require remedial action. The work to be ordered under this contract will be performed at various locations within the NAVFAC Pacific area of responsibility (AOR) (primarily includes NAVFAC Hawaii, NAVFAC Marianas, NAVFAC Northwest, and NAVFAC Southwest). Work may also be added and performed anywhere outside of the NAVFAC Pacific AOR, as required by the Government. The exact location of the required effort will be specified in the individual Contract Task Orders (CTOs). The Contractor may also, on occasion, be tasked to perform work for other NAVFAC Components, Department of Defense (DoD) or federal agencies as required by the Government. This contract may include performance of work on private, county, or state lands that are associated with the environmental sites identified above. Contaminants to be addressed are predominantly solvents, petroleum, oils and lubricants (POLs), metals, acids, bases, reactives, non-explosive ordnance residues or compounds, polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs), polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs), per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS), MEC (including all types of discarded military munitions and unexploded ordnance), emerging contaminants, pesticides, and G-RAM. Contaminants may be present in soils, marine or freshwater sediments, groundwater, air, sludge, surface water, and manmade structures. Contaminated sites include, but are not limited to, landfills, hazardous waste treatment, storage and disposal facilities, tanks, lagoons, firefighting training areas, and small arms ranges. The Contractor must have anti-terrorist/force protection (ATFP) hazardous material release incident response and remediation capabilities. This includes the capability to assist with or conduct decontamination following a release of ATFP-related hazardous materials such as anthrax or any chemical, biological, or radiological (CBR) agent. Work may include emergency or expedited contamination assessment and subsequent decontamination and remediation prior to returning facilities to normal operations, as well as preparation of work plans and coordination with applicable agencies. Task order values will range from \$5,000 to \$100,000,000. The period of performance will be five years. OFFERS ARE DUE BY 2:00 PM HST ON SEPTEMBER 9, 2026.
