Z -- Z1AA--ASBESTOS-CONTAINING FLOOR TILE AND MASTIC REMOVAL DURHAM VAMC SOLICITATION (SOL)

NAICS: 562910. THIS IS A SERVICE-DISABLED VETERAN-OWNED SMALL BUSINESS (SDVOSB) SET-ASIDE. The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs seeks a contract to furnish all labor, supervision, materials, equipment, tools, and transportation necessary to remove asbestos-containing floor tile, mastic, and associated components in designated areas of the Durham VA Health Care System (VAHCS) in Durham, North Carolina. All work shall comply with applicable Federal, State, and Local regulations, including North Carolina HHCU requirements. Required services include mobilization and setup of containment; installation of protective barriers, signage, and site control measures; removal of floor tile, mastic, and stair tread coverings using infrared radiant floor tile removal equipment, low-odor mastic remover, and hand-held tools; cleaning, waste packaging, labeling, and offsite disposal in accordance with federal and state regulations; post-removal air clearance sampling performed by a qualified third party using Transmission Electron Microscopy (TEM), with clearance levels not exceeding 70 structures per square millimeter; and demobilization and restoration of the work area to a clean, safe, and usable condition. Unless otherwise approved, work shall be performed between 8:00 AM and 5:00 PM; work must be coordinated with the COR to avoid disrupting patient care. The Government intends to issue an award to the responsible offeror whose quote is determined to be most advantageous to the Government, based on a best-value determination considering technical capability, past performance, and price. B -- 432 SPTS JP-8 FUEL SPILL REMEDIATION AND SAMPLING (COMBINE)

NAICS: 562910. THIS IS A TOTAL SMALL BUSINESS SET-ASIDE. The U.S. Department of the Air Force requires a contractor to perform complete soil remediation and confirmatory sampling for an estimated 500-gallon JP-8 fuel spill located on Bureau of Land Management (BLM) land approximately 2,000 feet west of the western fenceline of Creech Air Force Base in Clark County, Nevada. The primary intent is to excavate and safely remove all soils contaminated with JP-8 fuel at or above the concentration threshold of 100 mg/kg. Fuel penetration is not expected to exceed a depth of 36 inches. The total volume of contaminated soil to be removed is estimated not to exceed 70 cubic yards. The Contractor must achieve this goal in a single mobilization, ensuring that no repeated remediation or sampling efforts are necessary. NAICS: 562910. THIS IS A TOTAL SMALL BUSINESS SET-ASIDE. The National Park Service seeks a contractor to provide all labor, materials, equipment, supervision, permits, testing, disposal, documentation, and incidental services necessary to perform selective asbestos abatement and preservation-sensitive restoration work associated with two historic fireplaces located within Olmstead's Quarters at Fort Pulaski National Monument located on Cockspur Island between Savannah and Tybee Island, Georgia. The work includes the identification, containment, controlled dismantling, removal, handling, transport, and disposal of asbestos-containing materials (ACM) located between the marble fireplace surrounds and firebox assemblies, as identified in the asbestos field notes and laboratory analysis indicating the presence of chrysotile asbestos. A site visit will be held from 10:00 AM - 11:00 AM on Thursday, July 30, 2026. NAICS: 562910. THIS IS A TOTAL SMALL BUSINESS SET-ASIDE. The U.S. Coast Guard seeks a contractor to provide all labor, materials, equipment, and supervision necessary to perform comprehensive bullet trap cleaning and debris removal services. Work includes removal of all rubber pellets and debris from the back wall of the range; on-site processing and sifting of materials to separate and dispose of hazardous and nonhazardous waste; allowing U.S. Coast Guard (USCG) personnel to inspect and repair the back wall; returning cleaned rubber pellets to the back wall in a uniform slope and adding fresh pellets as needed; removing all frangible debris, including shotgun wadding, paper, and cardboard fragments; collecting debris samples for laboratory analysis of lead content; collecting daily air quality samples during work activities for laboratory analysis; wet scrubbing and cleaning the entire range floor after pellet replacement; and properly disposing of all trash, excess materials, and hazardous materials in accordance with applicable Federal, State, and local regulations.
