F -- CERCLA SITE INSPECTION – CODY/CADY MINE SITE, MARK TWAIN NATIONAL FOREST, WAYNE COUNTY, MISSOURI (COMBINE)

NAICS: 541620. THIS IS A TOTAL SMALL BUSINESS SET-ASIDE. The U.S. Department of Agriculture Forest Service seeks a qualified contractor to perform a Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA) Site Inspection (SI) at the Cody/Cady Mine Site, an abandoned iron mine managed by the Forest Service in Wayne County, Missouri. The SI will determine the presence and extent of on-site soil contamination, focusing on arsenic (As) and lead (Pb) concentrations. The work includes incremental sampling methodology (ISM) soil sample collection, laboratory analysis, and preparation of a Site Inspection Report. The work includes collecting 27 incremental soil samples and 12 QA replicates across designated Decision Units, laboratory processing and analysis for TAL metals using EPA SW-846 methods and required quality assurance and quality control procedures. The contractor will prepare a Site Inspection Report with validated analytical results, comparisons to applicable federal, state, and tribal criteria, maps, GIS data, and supporting documentation. The site is accessible by foot via a quarter-mile skidder trail off MO-49. Maps and GIS data will be provided. Deliverables include draft and final reports, ESRI File Geodatabase spatial data, and Section 508-compliant electronic documents. The former school site contains documented historical releases of petroleum and related contaminants from aboveground storage tanks (ASTs), day tanks, fuel pipelines, and former tank farms. Investigations between 2000 and 2025 have identified soil impacts, including diesel range organics (DRO), PAHs, VOCs, and related compounds of potential concern (COPCs). The site is in a remote Alaska Native community with limited infrastructure, requiring careful planning for logistics and community coordination. F -- REMEDIATION & SITE CHARACTERIZATION - KOTZEBUE, AK (COMBINE)

NAICS: 562910. THIS IS AN INDIAN SMALL BUSINESS ECONOMIC ENTERPRISE SET-ASIDE (SPECIFIC TO THE DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR). The Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) seeks a contractor to provide advance remediation and compliance at the Former IHS/BIA Hospital-School Pipeline Release site in Kotzebue, Alaska. Historical releases from a buried heating-fuel pipeline, tanks, and associated infrastructure have resulted in petroleum, VOC, and PAH contamination in soil and groundwater, with LNAPL periodically observed. The work will address remaining data gaps and support progress toward Cleanup Complete with Institutional Controls, including contaminated soil delineation along the former pipeline corridor and potential alternate release areas near monitoring wells MW11 and MW16, evaluation and rehabilitation or replacement of monitoring wells, groundwater monitoring and product recovery, and assessment of multi-season and tide-influenced groundwater conditions. Work will include development of a Site Characterization and Groundwater Monitoring Work Plan, Sampling and Analysis Plan, site-specific Health and Safety Plan, and logistics plan; additional test pits and/or soil borings; groundwater sampling and well-integrity evaluations; investigation-derived waste characterization and disposal; institutional controls planning; and evaluation of remediation alternatives suitable for Kotzebue's remote Arctic conditions, including in-situ treatment, ex-situ landfarming, and targeted excavation and disposal. The Contractor will prepare field activity summaries, laboratory data packages, an updated Conceptual Site Model, groundwater and soil trend analyses, a remediation alternatives analysis, and a final comprehensive report in accordance with ADEC requirements. Field activities must account for seasonal access, permafrost, frost-jacking, tidal and storm-surge influences, and coordination with local stakeholders. The Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) seeks a contractor to perform targeted environmental remediation activities at the former BIA School site in the Native Village of Napaskiak, Alaska. The property is in a remote Alaska Native community with limited infrastructure, requiring careful planning for logistics and transportation. Investigations between 2001 and 2025 identified soil and groundwater impacts from diesel-range organics (DRO), naphthalene, trimethylbenzenes, benzene, ethylbenzene, xylenes, and related compounds of potential concern (COPCs). Key findings from a 2024-2025 site characterization include residual petroleum contamination in Areas A-D; fluctuating DRO and naphthalene exceedances in groundwater; and well integrity issues due to permafrost, shallow groundwater, and frost-jacking. Work will include preparation of a technically accurate work plan, safe and compliant fieldwork, quality sampling that meets Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation data quality objectives, community notification, and development of final reports. NAICS: 562910. THIS IS A TOTAL SMALL BUSINESS SET-ASIDE. The U.S. Department of the Air Force, Air Force Reserve Command, requires a contractor to abate, remove, and dispose of asbestos-containing materials (ACM) from Building 806 at the Niagara Falls Air Reserve Station in Niagara Falls, New York. The total area of floor tile and black mastic needing asbestos abatement is approximately 430 square feet. The contractor is responsible for verifying all site conditions and material quantities before commencing work. The contractor will need to continue abatement activities until satisfactory clearance air sampling results are obtained from an independent third-party air-monitoring contractor.
