F -- PHASE I ENVIRONMENTAL SITE ASSESSMENT FOR GPRO (COMBINE)

NAICS: 541620. THIS IS AN INDIAN SMALL BUSINESS ECONOMIC ENTERPRISE (ISBEE) SET-ASIDE (SPECIFIC TO THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR, BUREAU OF INDIAN AFFAIRS). The Bureau of Indian Affairs requires a contractor to conduct a Phase I Environmental Site Assessment (ESA) for property proposed for acquisition by the United States in trust for the benefit of an Indian Tribe or individual Indian. The purpose of the Phase I ESA is to identify existing or potential environmental conditions that could affect the proposed fee-to-trust acquisition and to help the BIA determine whether additional environmental investigation is warranted. The Phase I ESA shall provide the BIA with sufficient information to evaluate potential environmental liabilities and determine whether additional environmental investigation or assessment may be necessary before the property is accepted into trust. Work will include a records review of environmental and historical information concerning the subject property and surrounding properties; site reconnaissance to evaluate visible evidence of potential environmental concerns; interviews, as appropriate, with knowledgeable persons identified by the Government, property owner, occupant, Tribal representative, or other available sources; and an environmental condition evaluation using the information collected. The contract will have a period of performance from September 24, 2026, through September 30, 2027. OFFERS ARE DUE BY 5:00 PM PDT ON SEPTEMBER 3, 2026.

F -- ASBESTOS REMOVAL AND DISPOSAL (SOL)

NAICS: 562910. THIS IS A FULL AND OPEN COMPETITION. The United States Publishing Office seeks a contractor to provide asbestos-removal services at its Central Complex, located at 732 North Capitol Street in Washington, DC, and its warehouse facilities, located at 8660 Cherry Lane in Laurel, Maryland. The Central Complex consists of four (4) buildings that were originally constructed in the 1930s and are connected or within close proximity. The buildings range in height from three (3) to eight (8) stories, totaling 1.4 million square feet. Asbestos-containing material (ACM) can be found throughout the Central Complex in building materials such as pipe insulation, troweled-on plaster, fire doors, wallboards, roof chalk and sealants, and vinyl floor tiles. Though much of the building's ACM has been removed, some remains. On rare occasions, ACM from the warehouse facilities may need to be removed if it is disturbed or to accommodate remodeling efforts. For general asbestos-removal projects, the contractor shall perform a site visit within three (3) business days of receiving a request from GPO for an asbestos assessment. The asbestos-abatement assessment/work plan is due within five (5) business days after the site visit. Before starting any work, the contractor and

COR shall agree on an overall schedule. The award will be a firm-fixed-price contract with a one-year base period and four one-year option periods. OFFERS ARE DUE BY 1:00 PM EDT ON SEPTEMBER 10, 2026.

NAICS: 562910. THIS IS A TOTAL SMALL BUSINESS SET-ASIDE. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) Detroit District is seeking a contractor for a Firm-Fixed-Price (FFP) environmental services contract for the Tar Lake Superfund project located in Mancelona Township, Michigan. The project includes excavating contaminated soil and expanding a bio-sparg system. The project will involve excavation of approximately 172,500 tons of contaminated soil, backfilling with clean imported soils, installing new bio-sparg wells, and installing an approximately 160-square-foot pre-engineered structure to house the bio-sparg system compressors. Ancillary activities include abandoning existing groundwater monitoring wells, installing new groundwater monitoring wells, installing erosion control measures, conducting a utility survey to locate existing bio-sparg system piping, confirmation soil sampling, and site restoration. The project also includes the development of a Quality Assurance Project Plan (QAPP) prior to the start of any project activities. The QAPP will detail the planning, implementation, and assessment steps for environmental data operations to ensure quality. The QAPP will follow EPA's standard QAPP format and will require the contractor to host three to four scoping meetings with appropriate EPA personnel to ensure that the QAPP is EPA-compliant. The award will be a firm-fixed-price contract with a period of performance from October 1, 2026, through September 30, 2030. OFFERS ARE DUE BY 2:00 PM EDT ON SEPTEMBER 21, 2026.
